
Year 2017 started with all of our activities in Aleppo city being shutdown, our staff have displaced. The year has started with 3 clinics in Aleppo and Idleb country side, and gradually a new Syria office has been established, staff has been relocated. And 8 new dental clinics were established in Aleppo northern and western countryside. Besides supporting 10 other clinics in Idleb governorates. All in coordination with Aleppo and Idleb health directorates. We exceeded our monthly rate of treatment in 2017. We reached out to 199 community in total, treating 44,864 patient, and launched awareness campaigns in 41 schools, providing hygiene kits and educational sessions to 1,787 child.
